About IIBAT

The International Institute of Biotechnology and Toxicology (IIBAT), formerly known as Fredrick Institute of Plant Protection and Toxicology (FIPPAT) was established as an agriculture and plant protection based research and development unit way back in 1978. The Institute later became a non-profit research society and duly recognized by the Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India under the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR) scheme. In 2004, IIBAT became a Good Laboratory Practice (GLP) certified Contract Research Organization (CRO) by the National GLP Compliance Monitoring Authority (NGCMA).

As a pioneer in the conduction of non-clinical health and environmental safety studies, IIBAT serves as a bridge between industry and regulatory bodies for more than three decades. IIBAT's rich experience and state-of-art infrastructure makes it possible to conduct studies involving wide range of test items such as agrochemicals, pharmaceuticals, bio-pesticides, cosmetics and veterinary products as per various national and international guidelines such as OECD, OCSPP (OPPTS), ICH, US-FDA, Schedule Y, CIB-RC and others by strictly adhering to the OECD Principles of GLP. The Institute offers services in the areas of mammalian toxicology, genetic toxicology, ecotoxicology, analytical chemistry, radioisotope-labeled studies and household insecticides efficacy evaluation.

Apart from GLP, IIBAT's commitment to quality management practice is explicit through its accreditation for international standards like, ISO 9001:2015, ISO 14001:2015 and ISO 45001:2015. A new, fully equipped, state-of-the-art Package Testing Laboratory has been recently established and is to be fully functional after completing the ISO 17025 accreditation. The institute owns an on-site agriculture farm (about 70 acres) and the Institute's excellent network among the farmers across the nation enables the conduction of on-site and multi-site efficacy trials with agrochemicals.

About the Conference

The Parliament of India passed the Insecticides Act on 02nd September 1968 to regulate the import, manufacture, sale, transport, distribution and use of insecticides in order to prevent the risks to human beings, animals and environment through the Registration Committee (RC) of Central Insecticides Board (CIB). This Act, by September 2018 has completed 50 years of its enactment and effectuation. Marking this significant event in the history of Indian pesticides regulations, this conference celebrates the Golden Jubilee of the Insecticides Act 1968 with particular emphasis on its impact on food safety and food security. This conference provides a unique platform for the regulators and its stakeholders, experts and scientists to share their experience and knowledge and to propagate their views to the stakeholders concerned with the pesticide / insecticide business that lies within the boundaries of the Insecticides Act, 1968.
